Historically, once a year Methodist congregations would gather together with their Presiding Elder and discuss the business of the congregation. They would look back at the steps forward in faith, mourn those who had passed, and look toward the future with the election of leadership and setting of priorities for the coming year. Often this Charge Conference season was in the Fall and it presented an annual check-up on the state of the congregation. Over the years, fewer people have participated in this work and it has become less of a worship service and celebration and more of a perfunctory administrative task.

Years ago I met a congregation that created layers of engagement to facilitate greater participation and life among the membership. Church conference continued as usual (though more people started coming), they regularly reported actions taken by the leadership to the membership (we've started this), and in the Spring they created a second check-in opportunity. In April, the Ad Council is going to host a potluck on April 28th to have an opportunity to share with the congregation the many things that are happening, some behind the scenes, and others that are front and center. The hope is that this 6-month cycle will help increase communication, build trust, and help us focus on making disciples of Jesus Christ. During the meeting the various leadership committees of Marion Salem will share what is happening and how the congregation can participate. There will also be a time for questions and answers, and hopefully sharing from the congregation about dreams for the future.

My prayer is that you will make this a priority to attend, after worship on Sunday, April 28. Come ready to hear about many exciting things that are happening, get informed about serious matters that we face ahead of us, then share your hopes and dreams as we join together to discern all that Christ has in store for us.

Daytime Bible Study? Those who are interested in a daytime Bible Study should reach out to the church office or Pastor Jason. We'll start one if there is interest.


Pastor's Small Group Class Basic Christian Faith Wednesdays 7pm


The Delegates and Alternates will be representing us in Costa Rica. We elected the Reserves in case persons elected ahead of them are not able to fulfill their responsibilities—or if the General Commission on General Conference allocates more delegates to our Annual Conference. In either case, the reserved delegates will be elevated in order of election.

Each person representing the conference will be responsible for raising or supplying the funds needed for their travel, ground transportation, lodging and meals. Please pray for our delegation. Ask God for provision and resources—wisdom and discernment—the heart and mind of Christ—an overwhelming sense of unity and common vision—and a Spirit-controlled temperament as they engage in this important work.

While not elected to attend, Pastor Jason will still give regular updates about the work ahead for General Conference. The scope of the work of General Conference as well as the issues that are important to Marion Salem Church and the Allegheny West Conference.

(Also,) I'm writing to call for a Special Offering for Tornado Relief—and giving notice of future Volunteer-in-Mission (VIM) opportunities. As was announced at the beginning of (the Special Session of Annual) Conference, Pastor Cynthia Defibaugh (Hopewell Church) and Pastor Bryan Meadows (Cornerstone Church) live and serve in the Indian Lake region of western Ohio. That region was impacted by devastating tornadoes in the early hours of Friday, March 15. While the immediate needs are being cared for by state and national relief organizations—we anticipate needs becoming profound in the next several weeks.

Therefore, we are asking all the churches of the Allegheny West Conference to take a special offering for Tornado relief between now and April 7. Your gifts will be used in partnership with Pastors Defibaugh and

Meadows as they work with local disaster responders to meet needs on the ground after the state and national responders pull back. Once you've received your offering, please send it to the Conference through the online giving portal or by mailing it to the Allegheny West Conference, 1636 Graham Road, Reynoldsburg, OH 43068.

Please let your church disaster responders know that we will likely be calling for VIM teams to volunteer for disaster response and rebuilding work in the last half of April. We will notify the Conference if and when those opportunities are available.


