

אוריים א Maundy Thursday is April 17th and will commemorate the Last Supper. Good Friday is April 18th and "once again (we) look upon the cross where (He) died." Yet the glorious day of Resurrection is not far away, Easter Sunday is April 20th. You likely do not need me to remind you. If anything, major retailers are so desperate to sell their candy

supply, they're advertising markdowns have reached you. We know that Easter is coming, have you made plans?

COVID-19 brought with it disruption in worship patterns. Barna's surveys from 2020 found that a third of people stopped worshipping, and follow-up surveys indicate that they have not returned to worship virtually or inperson. Some virtual worshippers have considered returning in-person, yet have not made the leap. Out of the habit and comfortable with the virtual offerings, it's difficult to step out and return. Many found virtual offerings unsatisfying and do not participate actively.

So let me offer that if you have been thinking about worshipping this Easter—stop thinking about it and just do it. And here's how. Get involved in worship by:

- Worship virtually and be active. Sing the songs. Pray the liturgy. Comment and react to the video.
- Make an active plan to be in-person. Set out clothes the night before—even know what your breakfast is going to be. Remove the obstacles that would keep you from going.
- Ask a friend who is attending worship virtually or in-person. Their support can help get you going again.

Ready to go? Just haven't done it in a while? It's hard to get back into a habit. The good news is that for many of us we get to sleep in on Sunday still and make it in time for worship. Here's some suggestions to rebuild the habit:

- Review the previous week's service. Our services from previous weeks are on Facebook. This can help prepare you and relieve anxiety regarding expectations.
- Go with a friend! Having someone else to go with increases the odds you'll actually do something. It's called support and is one of the main purposes of the Church. (Bonus points if you invite someone who hasn't been attending too!)

Thinking about someone who hasn't been in a while? Over 80% of people in Ohio are not in worship on any given weekend. We all know someone and care about them. So, let's be invitational:

- Ask, don't tell.
- Share your Sunday service video with them and invite them to join you for worship.
- Offer a ride.
- If they counter with an offer to go to another congregation (and you know they haven't attended in a while), go with them (just let your pastor know you're on a mission!).
- If they aren't comfortable with in-person worship, help them get connected virtually. Let's be like Hebrews 10:25. Get back in the habit of gathering for worship and encouraging one another!






